

LA PLAGNE VALLÉE

At the entrance to the resort, La Plagne Vallée runs along the Isère river at around 700m altitude. Its towns, with their shops and train/bus station have a year-round and a seasonal population. Its historical monuments like the 1000-year old Saint Martin's basilica and the Montmayeur tower are part of a rich cultural offer that echoes the Savoyard traditions perpetuated for centuries in the hamlets along the valley.



WE LOVE

- / **The Versant du Soleil (the sunny side)** which, as its name implies, is a real dose of vitamins in summer and winter alike. The vines and apple trees make up a bucolic landscape with viewpoints to enjoy like a good wine!
- / **Its villages set on the mountainsides** to discover during a hike or an e-bike ride; they bear witness to Savoie's agricultural and architectural history.
- / **The cultural programme**, with the special Thursday events in Aime in the summer and shows all year round. Concerts at the foot of the basilica, open-air cinema, theatre... there's something for the whole family.

TO DO AND SEE

- / **A descent on the Isère river.** A legendary river that attracts kayakers from all over the world; as soon as spring arrives, you can try rafting or hydrospeed with the thrill of going down the rapids at Aime to the gorges at Centron. If you are not a water sports enthusiast, there is a "green" path that runs the 15 km along the river from Aime to Bourg Saint Maurice.
- / **Visit the buildings, chapels & churches** that are representative of the baroque art that is much appreciated in the Tarentaise! You can then continue on to the Beaufort cheese cooperative in Aime and try some of the famous local cheese that was awarded a Gold medal in 2017.
- / **The leisure park at the Versants d'Aime** ideal for families. The lake with its 'Pavillon Bleu' certification is refreshing and there is plenty to do: acro-branches, acro-bungy, bouncy games, kayak and stand-up paddle rental...
